Shackleton Walk • Landing Area Fortuna Bay: gravel beach area to the south of Hodson Point Stromness: beach area between the ships' propellers (200m from station) and mouth of the Shackleton Valley river • Closed Areas Closed Area A: burrowing petrel sites on scree slopes above Fortuna Bay and adjacent to Shackleton waterfall

Navigation on Shackleton's voyage to Antarctica

Shackleton, Worsley and four others embarked on a perilous 800 nautical mile (1,500 km) passage in the 22½ foot (69 m) James Caird to seek rescue from South Georgia It is ultimately a tribute to Shackleton's leadership and Worsley's navigational skills that all survived their ordeal Captain Frank Worsley's original log books

Shackleton wanted the best of everything, his vessel, supplies, food and crew Even though the Endurance had been lost, almost everything on it was able to be salvaged, thanks to the leadership and direction Shackleton provided his crew Shackleton operated best in a state of being under extreme amounts anxiety, sorrow, or pain
